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Summary of changes

Following the final project review meeting and the feedback provided by the European Commission, Deliverable **D5.2 – Report on the evaluation of the training courses** was revised to broaden the impact evaluation by integrating trainer feedback and consolidating quantitative and qualitative evaluation data collected across the project.

To address the EC review comment, the following updates were implemented:

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Executive Summary

This deliverable presents the consolidated evaluation of the training courses implemented under **WP5: Training Delivery and Evaluation**, in line with the activities defined in **T5.2 Implementation of training courses**, **T5.3 Evaluation process: feedback from participants**, and **T5.4 Evaluation reporting for revisions/adaptations**.

During WP5, the consortium implemented a comprehensive programme of upskilling and reskilling activities across seven training providers:

1. Stackfuel GmbH [henceforth **Stackfuel**]
2. JOIST Innovation Park [henceforth **JOIST**]
3. GrantXpert Consulting [henceforth **GX**]
4. European University Cyprus [henceforth **EUC**]
5. DIGIAN (Workearly) [henceforth **Workearly**]
6. PRIZZTECH (Robocoast) [henceforth **Robocoast**]
7. Danilo Dolci Center for Creative Development [henceforth **CSC**]

Collectively, the seven partners delivered **251 training courses**, significantly surpassing the original target of 100 courses. Participation also exceeded expectations, with over **16,483 participants** trained against a target of 15,000, and **5,198 SMEs** engaged against a target of 3,000.

EVALUATION METHODOLOGY

In accordance with **T5.3**, all training providers were required to collect structured feedback from participants at the end of each training course. Four partners—**GX, EUC, JOIST and CSC**—adopted a **common evaluation survey form**, developed collaboratively under WP5. This form was used across multiple courses and countries to gather harmonized feedback data. The **online survey form** is included in Appendix 1. Partners **GX** and **CSC** have provided ready-made individual reports. The bodies of these reports have been incorporated in the deliverable in appropriate sections.

Partner **Stackfuel** used their own institutional evaluation form and collected data for their training courses. However, the partner provided their dataset in a format harmonized with the common evaluation form mentioned above. As such, their answers have been integrated with the other partners. It should be noted here that the dataset from Stackfuel did not include answers for one question that the common evaluation form included. More specifically, the question “*I am satisfied with the trainer’s support*” did not provide any data.

Partner **Workearly** used their own institutional evaluation form and collected data for their training courses. Their dataset has been made available but is not harmonized with the common evaluation form mentioned earlier. As such Workearly’s answers will be presented separately.

Partner **Robocoast** used their own institutional evaluation form and collected data for their training courses. Furthermore, collected information has been formulated into individual course reports. The individual reports will be included in Appendix 3. The reports have been used to extract participation and satisfaction numbers for the course. Their answers will be presented separately in appropriate sections in this report.

CHALLENGES IN DATA COLLECTION

Collecting evaluation data across seven providers, multiple countries, and hundreds of training sessions proved demanding. Common challenges included the difficulty of obtaining complete survey responses, participant dropout at the end of sessions, and variation in internal tools used by providers. Despite these challenges, all partners made significant efforts to collect as much feedback as possible, including:

- Sending repeated reminders
- Encouraging participants during the session
- Providing quick-access links or QR codes

Where formal written surveys were not completed, trainers and organisational teams collected **informal feedback** verbally during or immediately after the sessions. These insights were also considered valuable and were incorporated into the analysis, particularly regarding course improvements, learner satisfaction, and suggestions for future delivery.

USE OF EVALUATION FINDINGS

In alignment with T5.4, EUC gathered and analysed all evaluation data, including survey responses, trainer feedback, and qualitative comments. The findings supported adjustments to course content, improvements in delivery methods, refinement of learning materials, and better alignment with participant needs and market relevance. Several providers revised and re-offered courses, integrating lessons learned from earlier delivery rounds.

Furthermore, an additional **Post-Training Impact Survey** was implemented for participants who had completed Level Up courses at least six months prior. This follow-up survey enabled the assessment of medium-term outcomes related to skills application, employability, productivity, and career development, complementing immediate post-course evaluations with a longitudinal impact perspective.

The overall findings confirm high levels of participant satisfaction, strong relevance to market needs, and a demonstrable impact on upskilling and reskilling efforts across Europe. Detailed participation analytics, satisfaction metrics, and impact analysis are presented in the full report.

Feedback from trainers

This section presents a consolidated analysis of **structured qualitative feedback collected from trainers** involved in the delivery of Level Up training courses across all consortium partners.

Trainer feedback represents a key qualitative dimension of the evaluation framework, as it captures professional insights on learner engagement, course delivery, and learning dynamics that extend beyond participant satisfaction metrics. Trainers, through their direct interaction with learners and course content, are uniquely positioned to assess the clarity, relevance, and practical effectiveness of the training activities.

The feedback was collected through written exchanges, structured follow-up communication, and post-delivery reflections. It focuses on core aspects of training quality and implementation, including course organisation, delivery methods, participant engagement, practical applicability of content, and identified areas for enhancement.

By integrating trainer feedback alongside quantitative participation data and participant evaluations, this section strengthens the overall assessment of training performance and impact. The qualitative evidence presented here supports a more comprehensive understanding of training outcomes, informs continuous improvement under WP5, and contributes to a balanced and robust evaluation of the Level Up training programme.

PARTNER-SPECIFIC TRAINER FEEDBACK

GrantXpert

Trainers collaborating with **GrantXpert Consulting Ltd** expressed strong appreciation for the overall organisation and professionalism of the training process. Feedback highlighted:

- excellent coordination and communication,
- well-managed sessions,
- positive participant response and engagement.

One trainer noted that the sessions were highly successful and well-received, while another emphasised the value of structured collaboration throughout the delivery phase.

JOIST

Trainers delivering courses through **JOIST Innovation Park** reported:

- high engagement evidenced through quiz and assignment completion,
- strong learner understanding of course material,

- frequent follow-up questions from participants seeking to apply knowledge in practice.

Trainers also highlighted that **step-by-step explanations and clear guidance** supported consistent learning outcomes across different learner profiles.

CSC (Danilo Dolci Center for Creative Development)

Trainers from **Danilo Dolci Center for Creative Development** provided consolidated and anonymised feedback indicating that:

- courses were well structured and accessible,
- content effectively supported the development of basic digital competences,
- Artificial Intelligence and Canva-related courses generated particularly strong interest.

While engagement levels were generally high, trainers noted that participation increased significantly when **concrete tools and practical examples** were introduced.

Robocoast

Trainers collaborating with **Robocoast** provided highly positive feedback on:

- smooth cooperation and clear communication,
- effective logistics for both online (Teams) and face-to-face delivery,
- strong participant enthusiasm and engagement.

Trainers reported no major issues or complaints and described the Level Up project as **well-organised, professional, and impactful**, with participants responding enthusiastically to the training topics.

Workearly

Trainer feedback collected through follow-up calls by **Workearly** highlighted strong learning outcomes across multiple courses:

- **Excel courses:**
Trainers observed significant improvements in participants' confidence, particularly among beginners, with strong engagement during hands-on exercises and immediate application to real work tasks.
- **AI and automation courses:**
Trainers reported high curiosity and motivation, with participants quickly identifying concrete use cases for AI tools within their workflows. Courses helped demystify AI and encouraged further experimentation.

- **No-code and automation tools:**

Trainers noted rapid confidence-building among participants, strong peer interaction, and creative thinking around process optimisation.

Overall, trainers concluded that the courses successfully balanced foundational knowledge with real-world applicability.

Stackfuel

Trainers from Stackfuel GmbH provided constructive feedback focusing on future enhancement:

- incorporating more industry-specific use cases,
- adding synchronous elements to support asynchronous learning,
- increasing interactivity through additional exercises, examples, and visualisations.

This feedback has been documented as part of continuous course improvement and aligns with participant suggestions captured through evaluation surveys.

EUC

Trainers from European University Cyprus reported strong learner engagement, with participants actively contributing to group discussions and sharing practical examples from their own work contexts. Trainers highlighted that the interactive format and the use of real-world case studies enhanced the relevance of the content and supported its immediate applicability to participants' professional roles.

Follow-Up Survey for the courses participants

In addition to the standard post-training evaluation survey, the Level Up consortium designed and implemented an **additional follow-up survey** to assess the **medium-term impact** of the training programme. This survey was developed specifically for project reporting purposes and was implemented **separately from the original evaluation instruments**.

The follow-up survey was distributed **only to participants who had completed Level Up courses at least six months before**, allowing sufficient time for the application of acquired knowledge and skills in real-world professional, entrepreneurial, academic, or voluntary contexts. This time-lag approach was intentionally adopted to strengthen the **validity of impact findings** beyond immediate satisfaction metrics.

The survey targeted participants across different employment statuses at the time of enrolment, including:

- individuals in education (school, university, or recent graduates not yet employed),
- unemployed or inactive participants, and
- employed or self-employed participants.

Through this approach, the consortium aimed to **consolidate quantitative and qualitative data already collected for the funding agency**, responding directly to the European Commission's recommendation to broaden impact evaluation. In total, **over 400 follow-up responses** were analysed, significantly strengthening the project's evidence base.

Objectives of the follow-up survey

The specific objectives of the additional follow-up survey were to:

1. assess medium-term employment and career outcomes following course completion;
2. capture how participants applied acquired digital, AI, data, cybersecurity, marketing, and business skills in practice;
3. document career development effects beyond formal employment change, such as improved productivity, efficiency, confidence, or entrepreneurial activity;
4. complement immediate post-course evaluations with a longitudinal, impact-oriented perspective; and
5. provide a structured consolidation of quantitative and qualitative impact data for reporting purposes.

ANALYSIS OF PARTICIPATION PROFILE AND MEDIUM-TERM IMPACT

The additional follow-up survey provides valuable insight into the **profile of Level Up participants** and the **medium-term impact** of the training programme, complementing the immediate post-course evaluations with a stronger impact perspective.

PARTICIPANT PROFILE

The follow-up survey confirms that Level Up successfully reached a **diverse yet clearly employment-oriented audience**. A strong majority of respondents (approximately **72%**) were **employed (full-time, part-time, or self-employed)** at the time of enrolment, indicating that the programme primarily served **active professionals and entrepreneurs** seeking to upskill. At the same time, the programme also attracted participants in education (**around 11%**) and individuals who were **unemployed or inactive (approximately 15% combined)**, demonstrating inclusiveness and relevance across different labour market positions.

Gender data show a **high participation of women (around 72%)**, highlighting the project's strong contribution to **gender inclusion in digital and emerging technology skills**. Country-level data further indicate a broad European reach, with particularly strong participation from Finland (**around 70%**), complemented by participants from Cyprus, Greece, Italy, Germany, and other countries.

EMPLOYMENT OUTCOMES

Among participants who were **in education or recent graduates not yet employed at the time of enrolment**, the results are particularly strong: **approximately 73% reported having found a job after completing the programme**. This suggests a clear employability benefit for younger participants and those transitioning into the labour market.

For participants who were **unemployed or inactive at enrolment**, around **23% reported securing employment** after completing the programme. While more modest, this outcome is significant given the structural barriers often faced by this group and demonstrates the programme's potential to support labour market reintegration.

Among participants who were **employed at the time of enrolment**, the majority (≈ 280 responses) reported **no formal change in employment status**, reflecting that many participants were already in stable jobs. Importantly, this stability does not indicate a lack of impact:

- around 25 respondents reported career progression (promotion or higher-skilled roles),
- approximately 15 respondents experienced improved employment stability, and
- around 20 self-employed participants highlighted tangible improvements in business performance or productivity.

CAREER DEVELOPMENT AND SKILLS IMPACT

The strongest and most consistent impact of Level Up is observed in **skills development and work performance**.

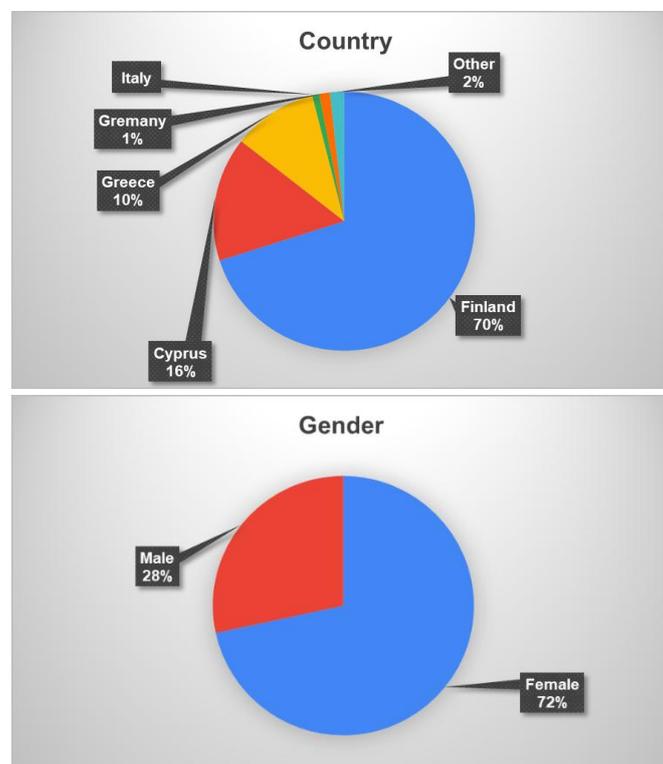
- **Approximately 320 responses** explicitly highlighted **skills development and upskilling**, particularly in AI, digital tools, cybersecurity, marketing, and business applications.
- **Around 190 responses** reported **improved work performance and efficiency**, including higher productivity, faster task completion, and increased confidence in applying new tools.
- **About 130 responses** pointed to **entrepreneurial and business development impact**, such as improved workflows, enhanced marketing capacity, or increased competitiveness.
- **Over 110 responses** emphasised **career orientation and future opportunities**, including increased employability, motivation for career change, or preparation for further studies.

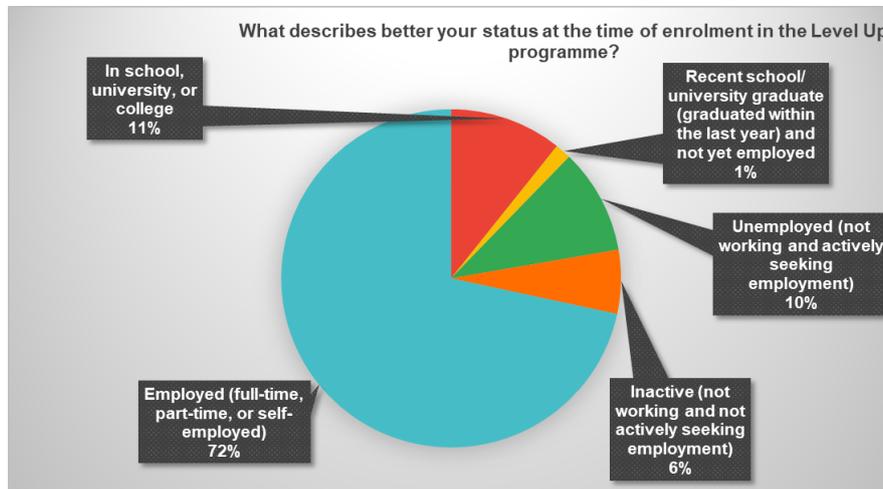
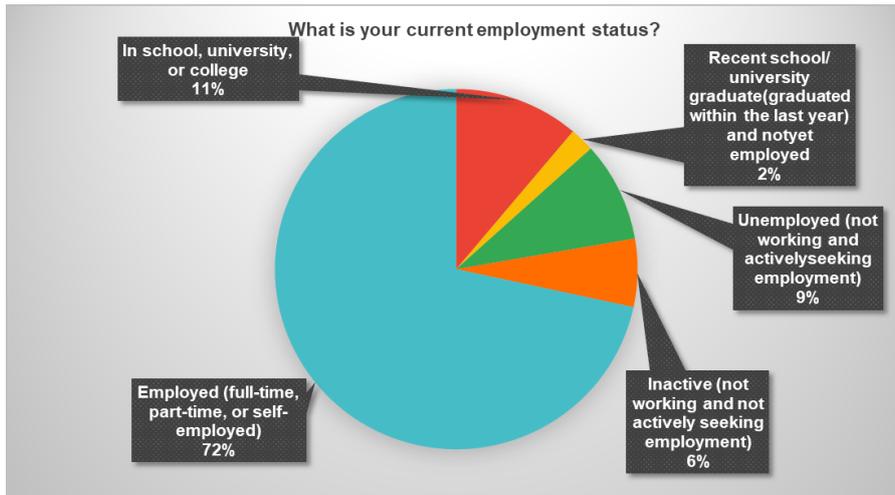
Only a **small minority (≈ 55 responses)** reported limited or no direct career impact, often noting participation driven by personal interest rather than immediate professional need.

OVERALL IMPACT ASSESSMENT

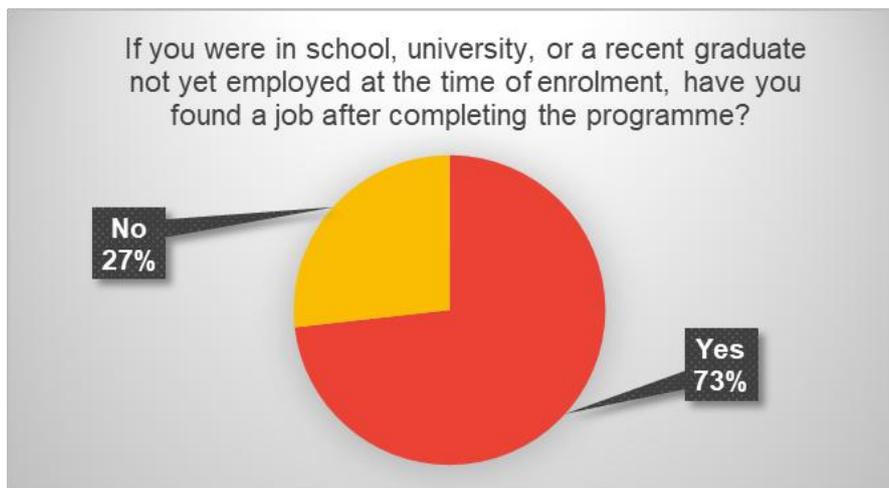
Overall, the follow-up survey provides strong evidence that Level Up achieved **substantial medium-term impact**, particularly in **skills acquisition, productivity gains, and employability readiness**. While immediate job changes were not universal—especially among already-employed participants—the programme clearly strengthened participants’ **human capital, career resilience, and capacity to adapt to digital transformation**, directly supporting the project’s objectives and the priorities of the Digital Europe Programme.

UNEMPLOYED OR INACTIVE AT THE TIME OF ENROLMENT

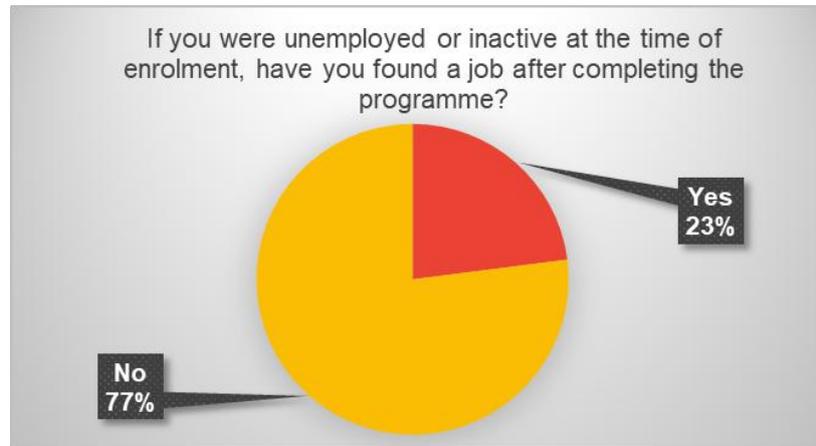


Figure 1: Follow-Up Survey results

The majority of respondents reported **no immediate change in their formal employment status** following programme completion, reflecting the fact that many participants were already in stable employment. A smaller number indicated **career progression**, including promotions or transitions to higher-skilled roles, while others reported **improved employment stability**, such as moving from under-employment to full-time work. Notably, several self-employed participants highlighted **improvements in productivity, efficiency, or business development**, even where no formal employment change occurred. A significant subset of responses was classified as **not applicable**, corresponding to participants who were not employed at the time of enrolment.

Due to the optional and open-ended nature of the question, responses were analysed qualitatively and grouped into thematic categories reflecting the main types of perceived career impact. Reported figures indicate aggregated mentions rather than unique respondents.

Participation to Evaluation Surveys

This document is based on data provided by the partners for feedback collected for delivered courses. It presents information collected between 03/11/2023 and 10/10/2025. 5 partners (GX, EUC, JOIST, CSC and Stackfuel) provided data based on a common evaluation form enabling harmonised data collection and comparative analysis. Partners Workearly and Robocoast implemented their own internal evaluation tools, which are summarized in some form in the deliverable but not included in the statistical charts further below (related to participant satisfaction).

To contextualise the scope of the evaluation dataset, Table 4 below presents an overview of the total number of evaluation responses received across all partners, distinguishing between the common evaluation survey and individual partner evaluation tools.

This overview consolidates all quantitative evaluation data collected during the reporting period and demonstrates the breadth of participant feedback underpinning the participation analysis, satisfaction assessment, and impact evaluation presented in this deliverable.

Country participation

First, we present the participating countries and the numbers of feedback forms received. Below you can see two diagrams. On the left we have the top 10 countries from the data set associated with the common evaluation form (and referring to data collected in Greece, Cyprus, Italy and Germany).

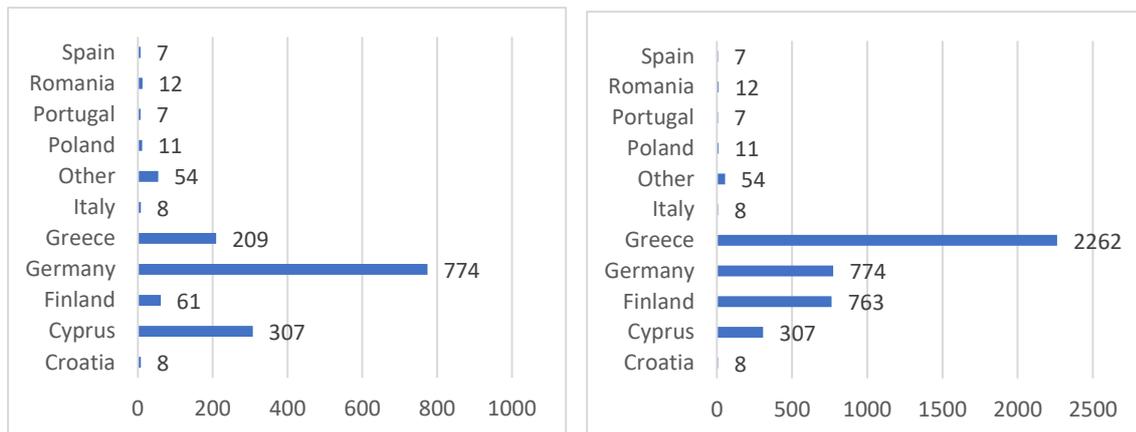


Figure 2: Feedback forms received (Top 10 country numbers)

On the right we again have the top 10 countries, but this time from the data set associated with all evaluation mechanisms (common form and individual implementations). The right diagram includes data from Finland as well as some more data from Greece.

Referring to the collective diagram on the right, most of the feedback was collected from Greece (53.7%), Germany (18.4%), Finland (18.1%) and Cyprus (7.03%). The feedback available was collected from 48 countries. Appendix 4 includes a listing of the countries.

Second, we present courses for which feedback was collected. The data listed 98 individual courses. The figures below show the top 10 in number of participant courses as well as the country in which the training took place.

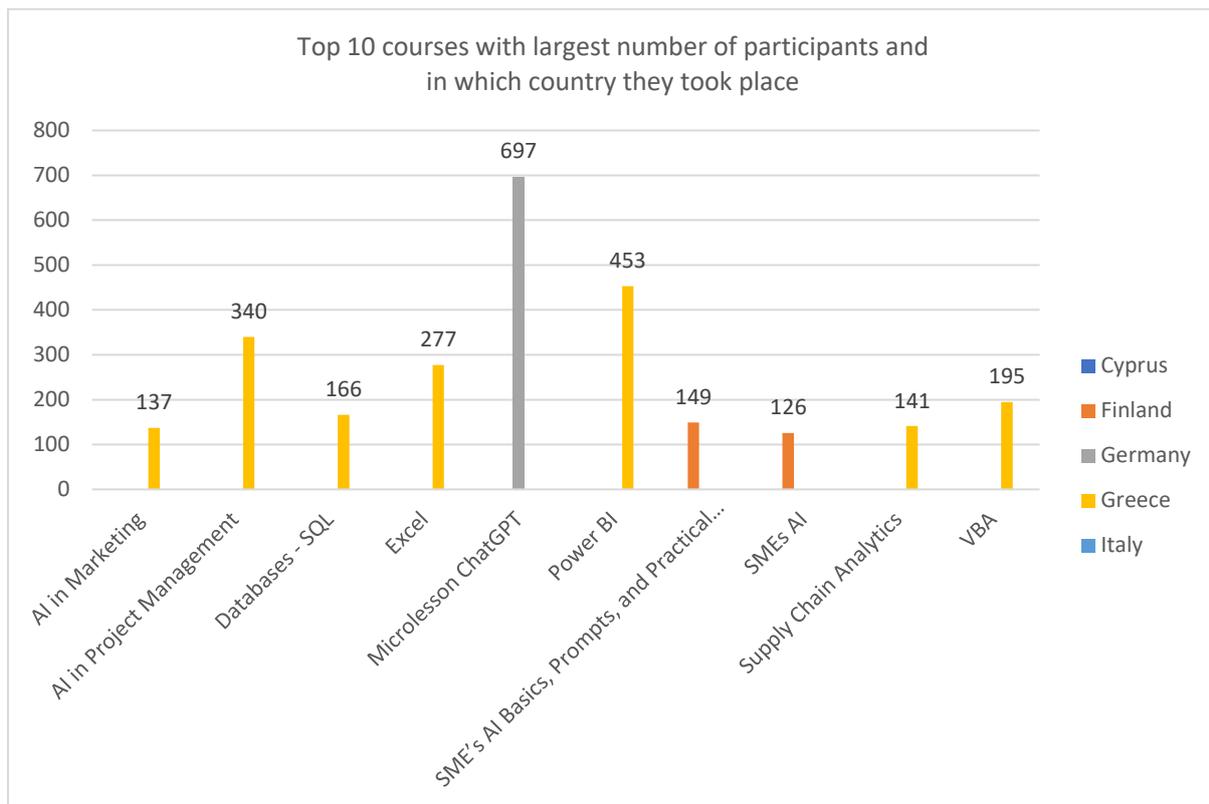


Figure 3: Top 10 participant number courses and their countries of implementation.

Participation by thematic area

Overview

We considered it useful to report on the numbers of respondents that participated in courses but produce grouping of courses relating to their thematic area. The project focuses on upskilling and reskilling SME employees or jobseekers in Cybersecurity, Data Literacy, Data Analytics, Artificial Intelligence, microelectronics / microcontrollers, Internet of Things, 3D printing and 3D modelling, cloud and programming. As such we identified potential categories or areas (as listed below) that seem to be addressed from various courses offered by various partners. The thematic areas focus on:

- Cybersecurity
- Artificial intelligence
- Business
- Data
- Media and Marketing and

- Digital Currency.

In what follows we have a subsection for each thematic area. In each subsection, we first present data that was available in the **common evaluation survey** dataset (GX, EUC, JOIST and Stackfuel) and then continue presenting (any applicable) equivalent finding based on data from Workearly and Robocoast.

Appendix 5 includes a complete listing of all courses included in each of the thematic areas mentioned above.

Cybersecurity related courses

Common evaluation survey

The figure below demonstrates the number of respondents to courses relating to cybersecurity

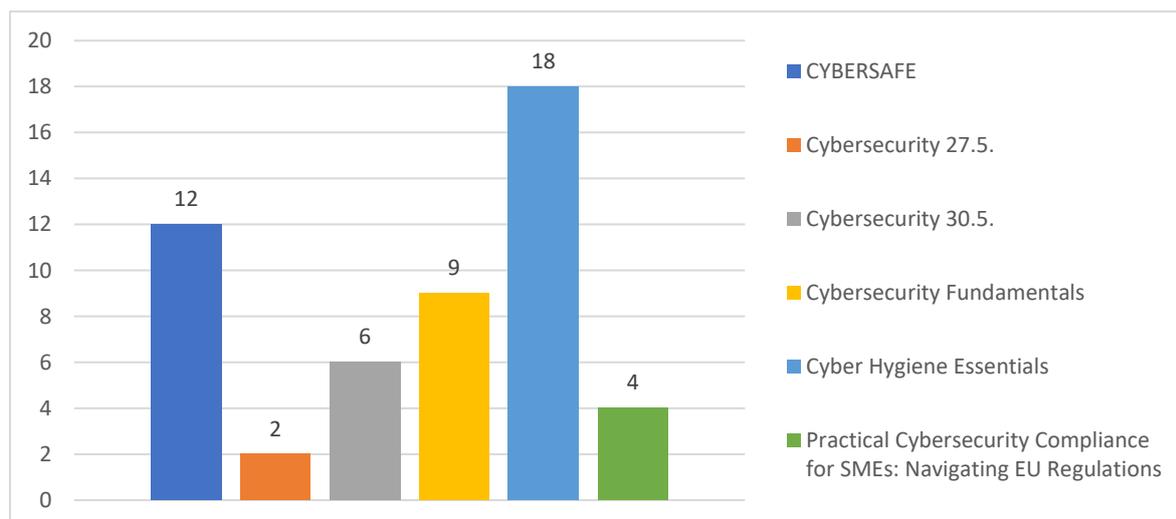


Figure 4: Respondent numbers in Cybersecurity related courses (51 out of 1494, or 3.41%)

Cybersecurity courses attracted a moderate but targeted level of participation, reflecting the sustained interest of SMEs in practical threat-prevention skills and regulatory obligations. In response to the question “**what did you like most**”, 10 answers mentioned the practical examples, the interactive activities and the quizzes that were used.

In answer to the question “**how can we improve the course**”, one response suggested that the course was recorded and made available to participants to watch again while two other participants made

suggestions about the duration of the course. One suggested to increase the duration to 5 hours and the second suggested the split of the course into two parts

Workearly and Robocoast evaluations

The Workearly set of courses did not include anything on Cybersecurity.

The Robocoast set of courses included one course titled “The importance of Cybersecurity for SMEs” which had 13 out of 702 respondents (or 1.85%)

Artificial Intelligence related courses

Common evaluation survey

The figure below demonstrates the number of respondents in AI related courses. (**Note:** the common evaluation survey did not include any large numbers of respondents for AI courses, apart from the one course in Germany on GPT. Other comparative numbers of responses were included in Greece or Finland, but these have been reported in the Workearly and Robocoast section below)

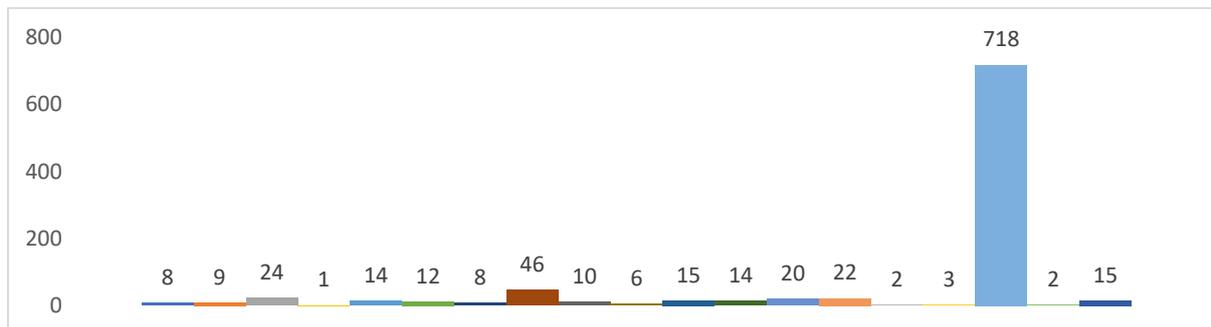


Figure 5: Number of respondents in AI-related courses (949 from 1494, or 60.52%)

AI related courses covered a wide range of applications across business, education, research workflows, and creative industries. This diversity illustrates both the consortium’s wide course offering and the cross-sector relevance of AI skills. They attracted high engagement reflecting a strong demand for practical training on emerging technologies. The highest participation courses in the graph above include:

- Microlesson GPT (718)
- ChatGPT for Digital Excellence: From Basics to Advanced Applications (JOIST) (46)
- ChatGPT in Education (24)
- Analyze the Future: Data and Artificial Intelligence in Business Development (20)



- Artificial Intelligence: Discover how to apply AI in your daily life (22)

Other notable course titles: Machine learning (15); Master Scholar GPT for research excellence (14); Artificial Intelligence (12); AI as a releaser of creative potential ¹ (14)

In response to the question “**what did you like most**”, 19 answers mentioned the practicals, a very well-chosen examples which demonstrated clear points. Also, a few participants commented on the quality of delivery from the pertinent trainer (identifying, for various people, characteristics like, clarity in explanation, sense of humour, expertise on the field, teaching effectiveness as well as their professionalism and paced delivery of the material). Learners particularly appreciated examples demonstrating how AI tools can streamline real tasks, such as content creation, data analysis, and research support. Trainer expertise was repeatedly highlighted as a key factor supporting understanding and confidence.

In answer to the question “**how can we improve the course**”, (referring to various courses) 4 respondents suggested that the seminar was face-2-face rather than online; 22 comments requested more practical examples and interactive activities; 7 participants (from various courses) suggested a longer duration for the seminar. These suggestions indicate that participants view AI as a topic requiring deeper exploration and sustained practice. Future versions of the courses may benefit from expanded hands-on components, guided exercises, and optional follow-up workshops.

Workearly and Robocoast evaluations

The following figure shows the number of respondents in AI-related courses in Greece (from Workearly).

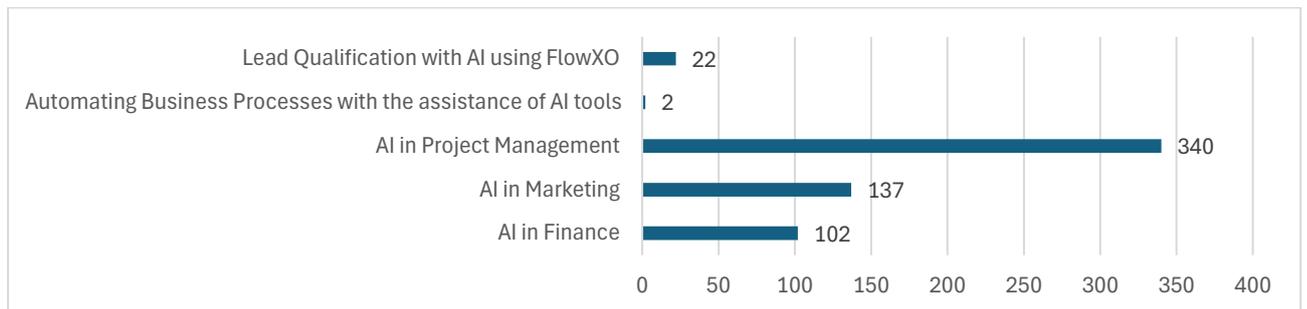


Figure 6: Workearly (DIGIAN) AI-related numbers (603 from 2053, or 29.37%)

The figure below shows the number of respondents in AI-related courses in Finland (from Robocoast)

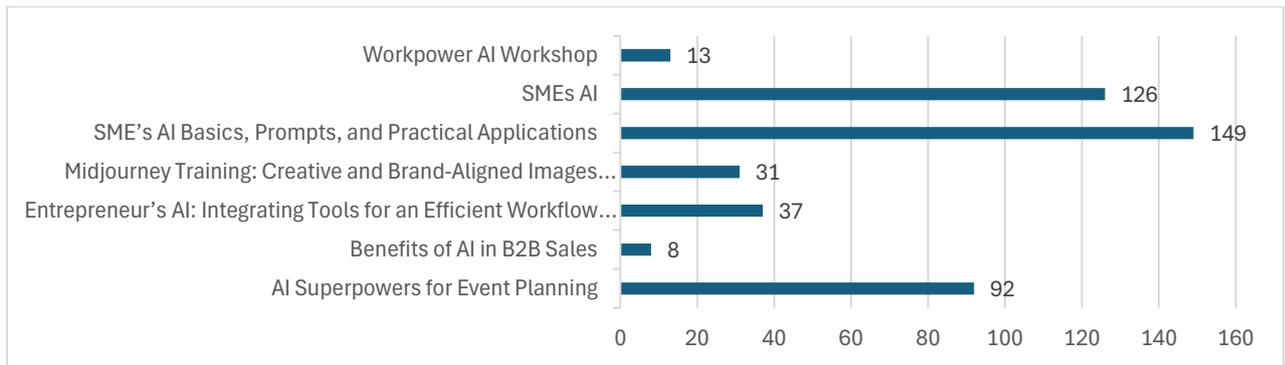


Figure 7: Robocoast (PRIZZTECH) AI-related numbers (456 from 702, or 64.95%)

Here too, we can see the increased interest in AI related courses and specifically in the above graphs we note that most courses focus on business aspects of SMEs (i.e. project management)

Business related courses

Common evaluation survey

The following graph shows the number of respondents that participated in business related courses. The Business thematic area included a diverse set of courses designed to strengthen SMEs' operational efficiency and digital capacity. These courses covered practical, work-oriented tools and workflows. The highest participation courses in the graph above include:

- Optimize Workflow with Canva: Enhance Efficiency, Collaboration, and Design in Project Management (28)
- Mastering Project Management with Notion (24)

- Analyze the Future: Data and Artificial Intelligence in Business Development (20)

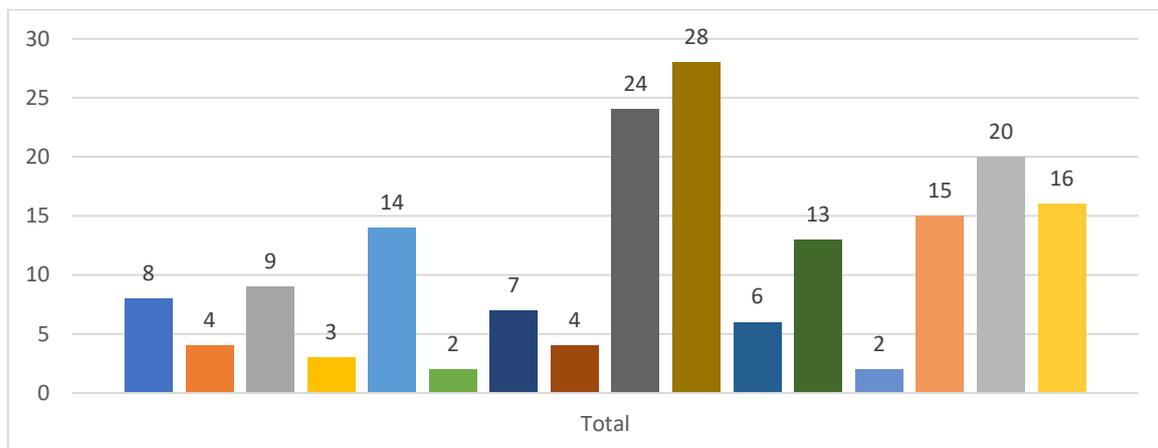


Figure 8: Number of respondents in business related courses

- Data Visualization with Power BI – Webinar (16)
- Junior Business Analyst Bootcamp (14)

Other notable course titles include: Power Automate: Automation and Optimisation of Business Processes (13); Google Tools to Run Your Business More Efficiently (9) and Simple Digital Tools for Businesspeople and Start-ups (7)

This variety reflects the digital skills most requested by SMEs seeking streamlined operations and improved productivity.

In response to the question “**what did you like most**”, participants highlighted the clarity of explanations and noted that many examples closely mirrored real SME scenarios, making the content directly applicable to their workplace.

In answer to the question “**how can we improve the course**”, several respondents indicated that additional practical examples, guided demonstrations, and hands-on exercises would help them better apply the concepts presented.

Overall, Business-related trainings were well received, with feedback emphasizing the value of interactive formats and real-world examples that align with the operational realities of SMEs.

Workearly and Robocoast evaluations

The figures below show the number of respondents in business related courses for Workearly and Robocoast.

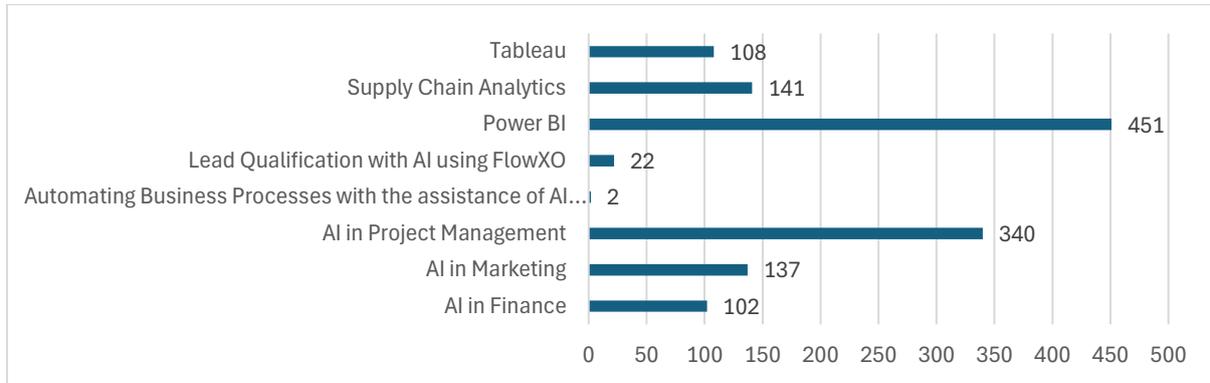


Figure 9: Workearly business related numbers (1303 from 2053, or 63.46%)

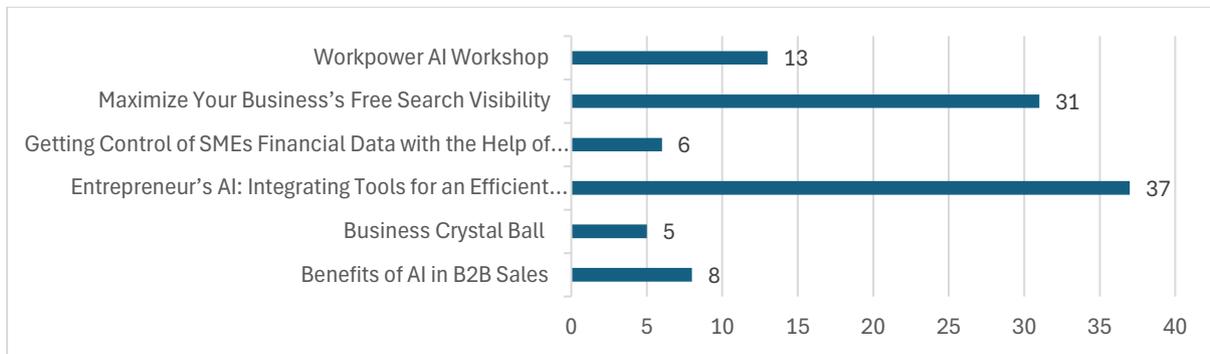


Figure 10: Robocoast business related numbers (100 from 702, or 14.24%)

Both partners included business related courses, but it is evident that Workearly focused nearly 2/3 of its courses (almost 63.5%) to business related aspects.

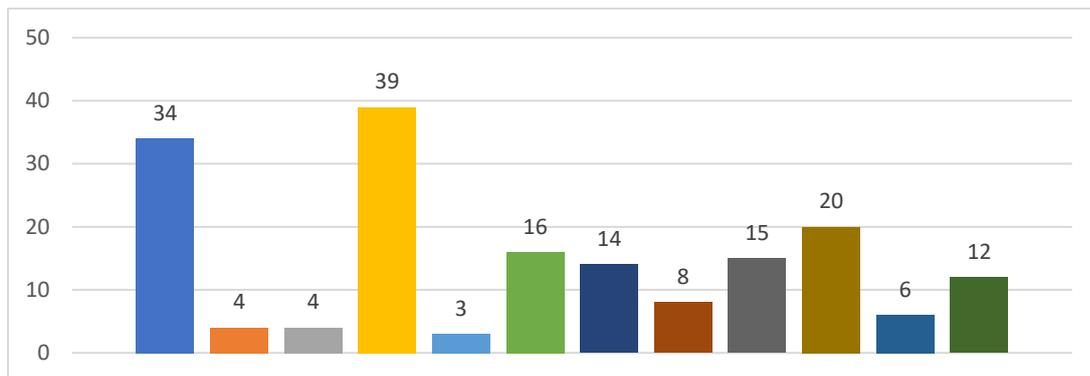


Figure 11: Data related numbers (175 of 1494, or 11.71%)

The data thematic area included a variety of courses assisting SMEs with data analysis and efficiency in business decisions and processes. We must mention the versatility and capabilities of Microsoft Excel, providing features and functions that help gain valuable insight on various business aspects. The highest participant number courses included:

- Excel of data reporting (39)
- Advanced Excel for data visualization and presentation (34)
- Analyze the Future: Data and Artificial Intelligence in Business Development (20)
- Introduction to time series analysis and visualization in Excel (16)

Other notable courses were: Junior business analyst bootcamp (14); Structured data (12) and Exploring Data Science and AI in Analytics with Python (8).

In response to the question **“what did you like most”**, several respondents mentioned the good structure of the course and how easy it was to follow and learn new things. Also mentioned that the topic was interesting.

In answer to the question **“how can we improve the course”**, (referring to various courses) several respondents mentioned they would like more examples and hands-on exercises.

Workearly and Robocoast evaluations

The figure below depicts the respondent participants in data related courses from the dataset of Workearly. The technologies mentioned are well known standards in the industry and tools that are heavily utilised in SMEs.

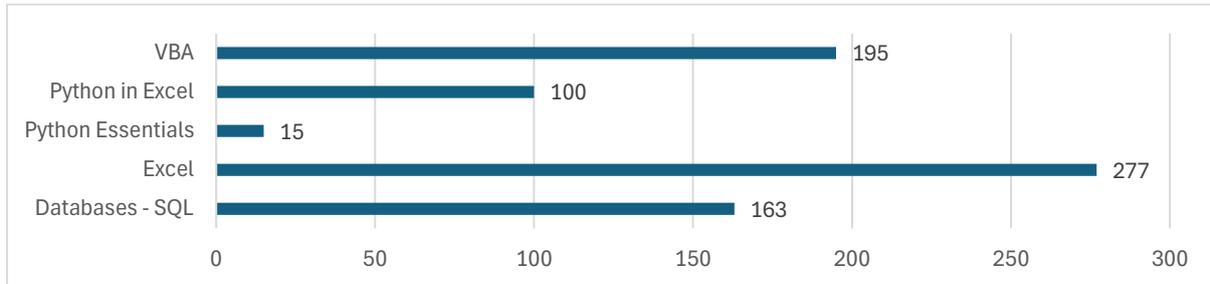


Figure 12: Workearly data related courses (750 from 2053, or 35.53%)

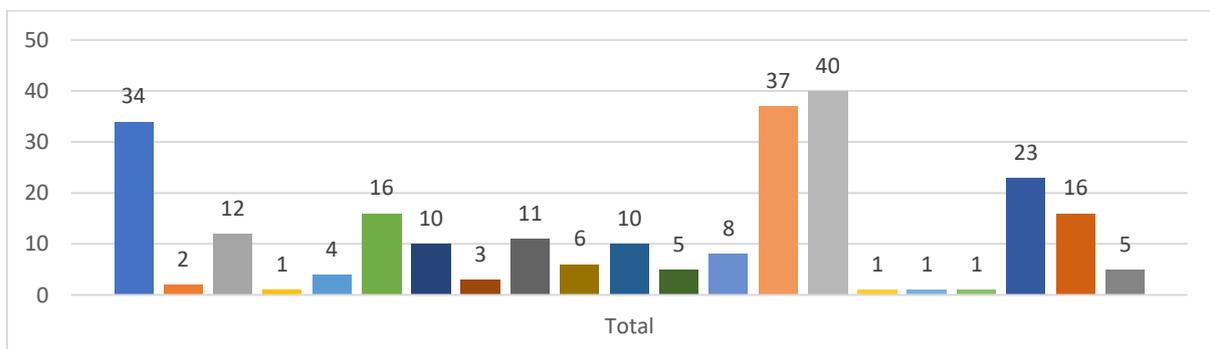


Figure 13: Media and Marketing related numbers (246 from 1494, or 16.46%)

The highest number courses in this thematic include:

- Wix: Building your own website easily, no programming skills needed (40)
- TikTok: learn how to create stunning videos (37)
- Advanced Excel for Data Visualization and Presentation (36)
- Category Visualization - Best Practices (23)

Other notable courses were: Data visualization with Power BI (16); Introduction to Time Series Analysis and Visualization in Excel (16) and two courses on Canva, having a total of 13 participants.

In response to the question **“what did you like most”**, (for various courses) a few respondents mentioned the good examples of the course; and also commented on the presenter being very well prepared and having a positive attitude.

In answer to the question **“how can we improve the course”**, (referring to various courses) several respondents mentioned they would like face-2-face seminars, having more examples and time to practice.

Workearly and Robocoast evaluations

The Workearly set of courses included one course titled “AI in Marketing” which had 137 out of 2053 participants (or 6.67%)

The Robocoast media and marketing related courses along with their participation numbers are given in the figure below.

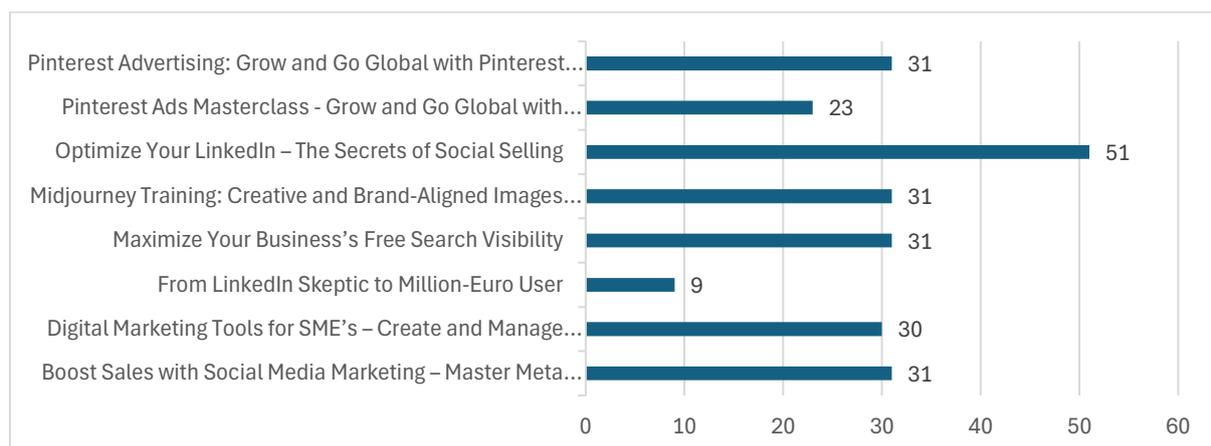


Figure 14: Robocoast media and marketing related numbers (237 of 702, or 33.76%)

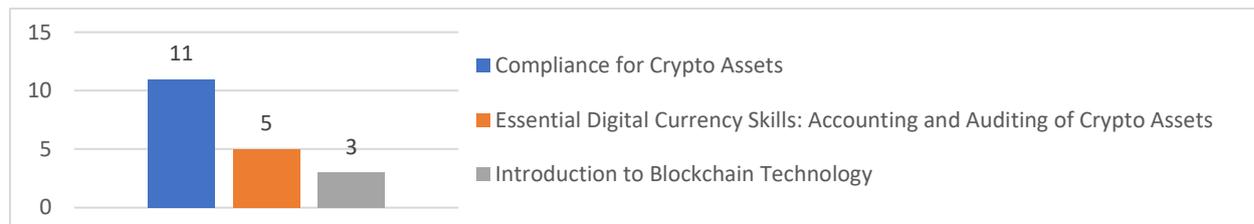


Figure 15: Participation numbers in Digital currency related courses (19 of 14940, or 1.27%)

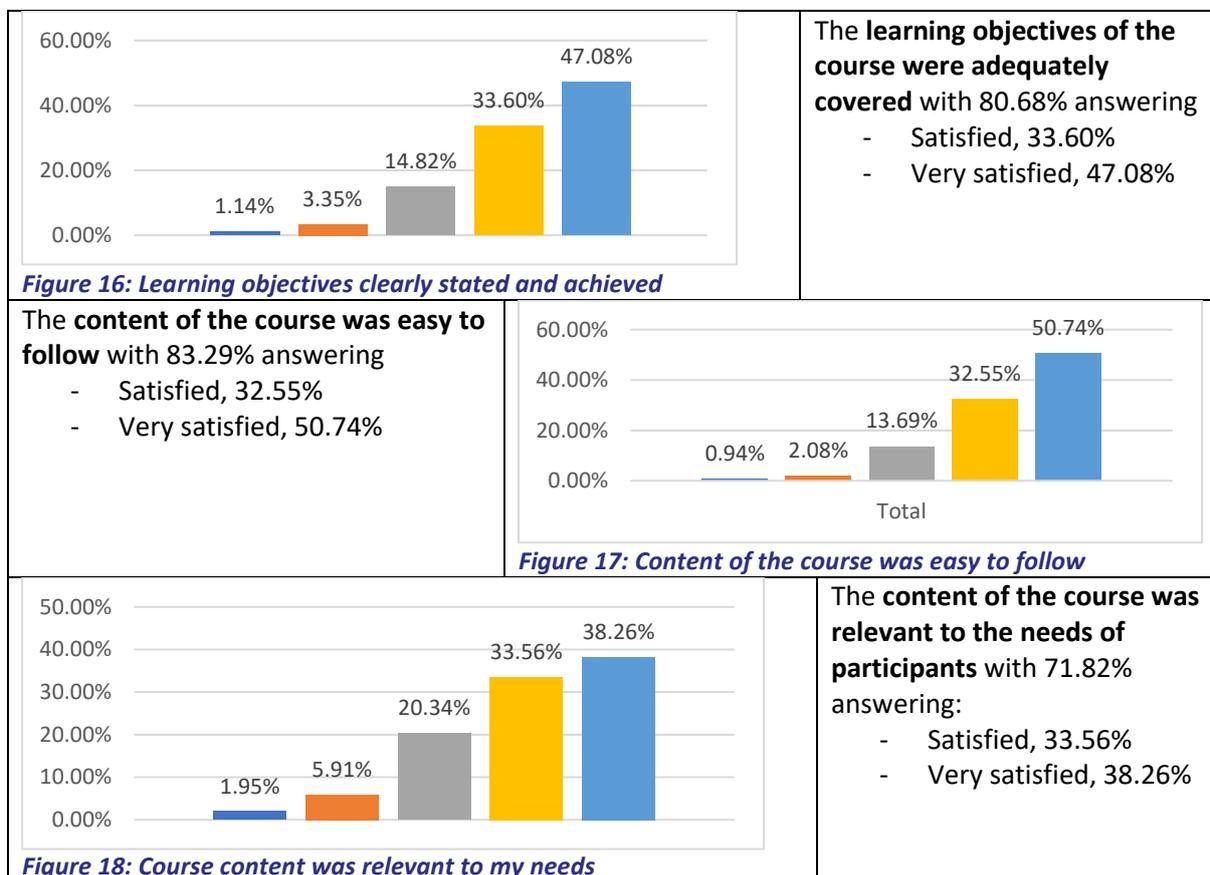

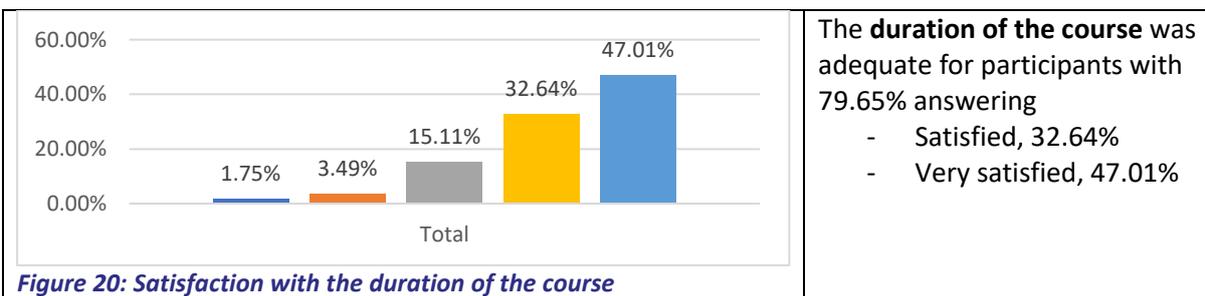
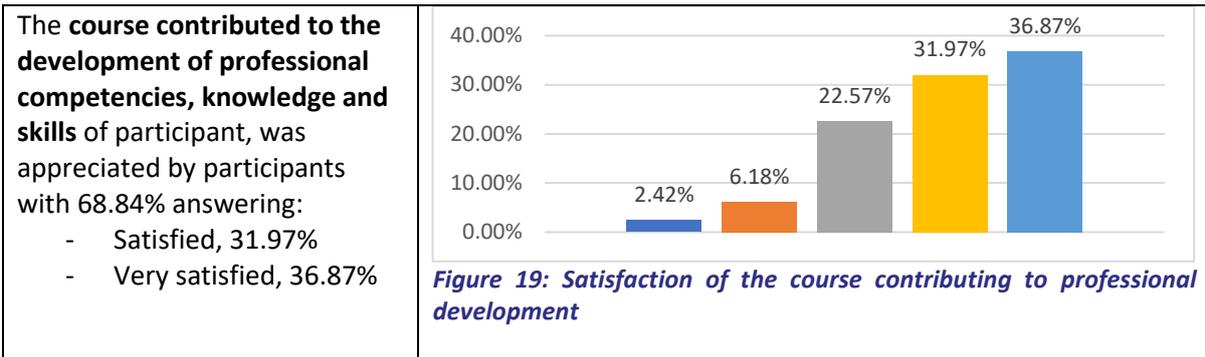

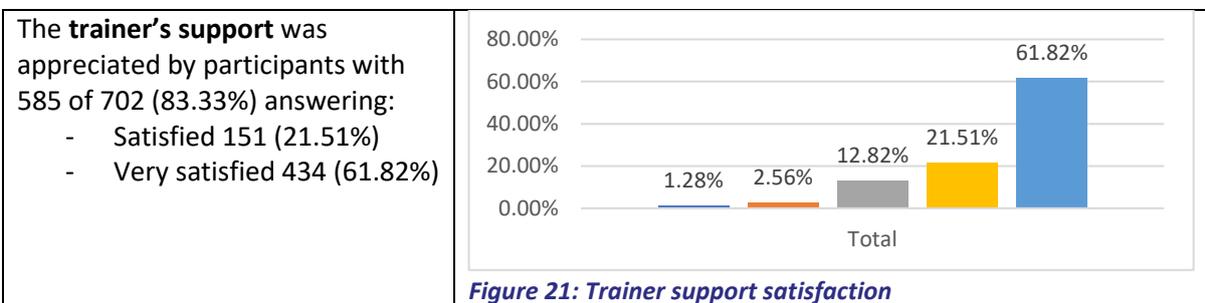
- Learning objectives

These questions were presented in a scale from 1 (very dissatisfied, being the worst, and shown first from left), to 5 (very satisfied, being the best, and shown first from right). What follows presents data for all courses in all countries.





The following graph relates to 702 answers from GrantXpert, EUC and JOINST and the Stackfuel data set did not include answer for the question below



Overall, considering scale categories 4 and 5 together, the results across all questions consistently exceed 68%. This high level of satisfaction demonstrates not only the relevance and quality of the training content, but also the programme’s effectiveness in strengthening participants’ digital competencies. The findings indicate that the courses substantially contributed to upskilling and reskilling efforts, equipping learners with practical knowledge and capabilities that support their active participation in the digital transformation.

Workearly

The Workearly data set included answers to 3 questions relating to participant satisfaction. The questions were set using a 1 (worst) to 5 (best) scale. In the graphs that follow we present the average

percentage for scale scores as recorded in the data. Note that scale 1 (very dissatisfied, being the worst, is shown first from left), and scale 5 (very satisfied, being the best, is shown first from right). The first question asked the participants to rate the section as a whole

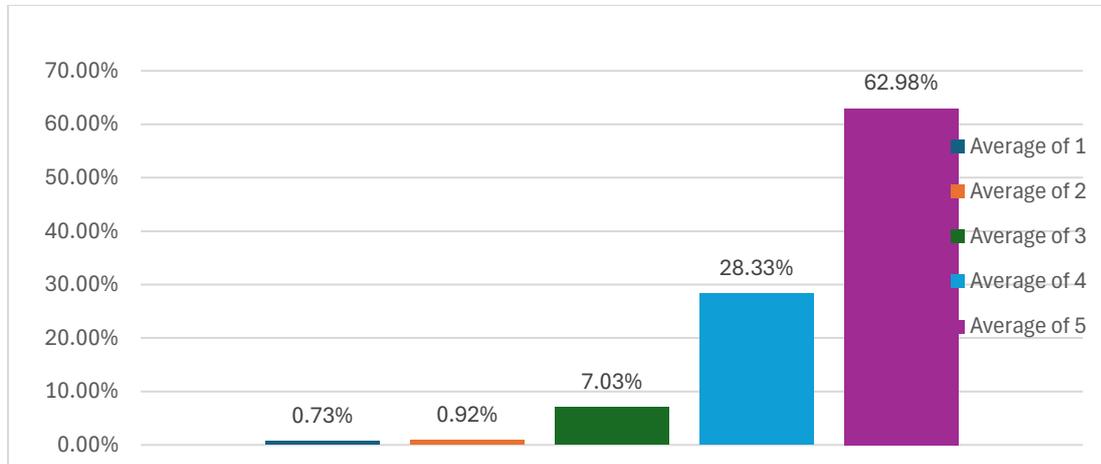


Figure 22: Q1: "How would you rate this section as a whole?"

The score at scales (4) "satisfied" and (5) "very satisfied" sum up to 91.31% which would render the sections quite successful.

The remaining two questions tried to assess a) whether the provided (during the training) exercises re-enforced the covered theoretical material as well as b) if the examples that were used to demonstrate concepts help participants understand how to approach. As it can be seen from the diagrams below both questions had favourable results with 88.38% of the participants finding the exercises useful, and 83.45% of the participants agreeing that the examples help them know how to tackle the exercises.

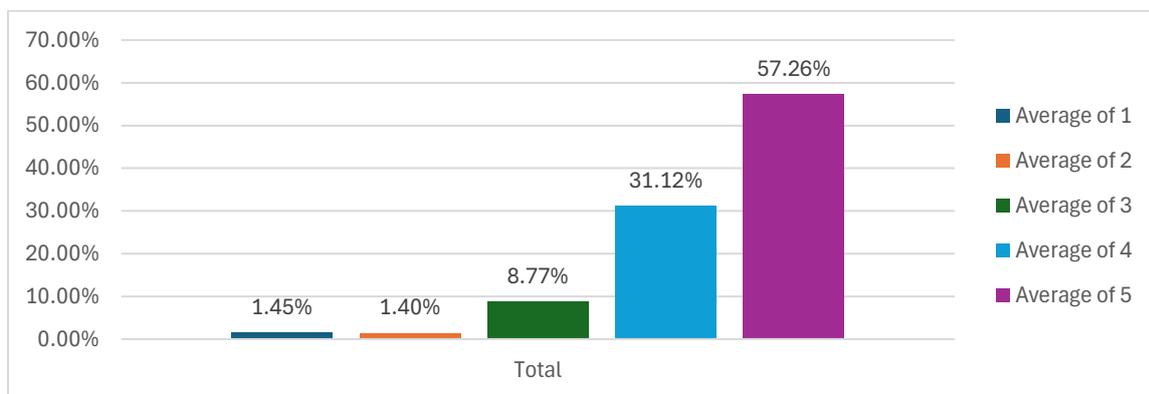


Figure 23: Q2: "The exercises effectively re-enforced the concepts covered in the theory section"

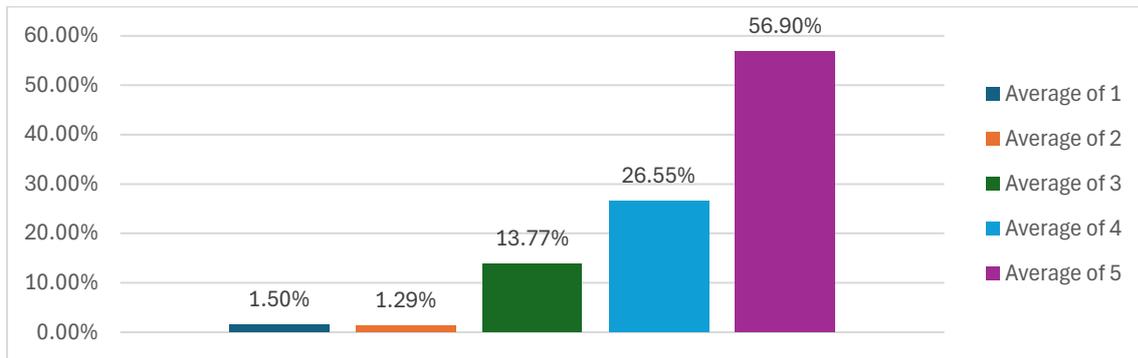


Figure 24: Q3: "The provided examples help you understand how to approach the exercises"

Robocast

The Robocast data set included the number of feedback forms received and the resulting score of participant satisfaction for each recorded course. Multiple instances of courses were present; they were grouped and the diagram below shows the average score of satisfaction that each course achieved. Values range from 50 to 100 with an average score (for all courses) of 82.16% which will characterize the courses successful.

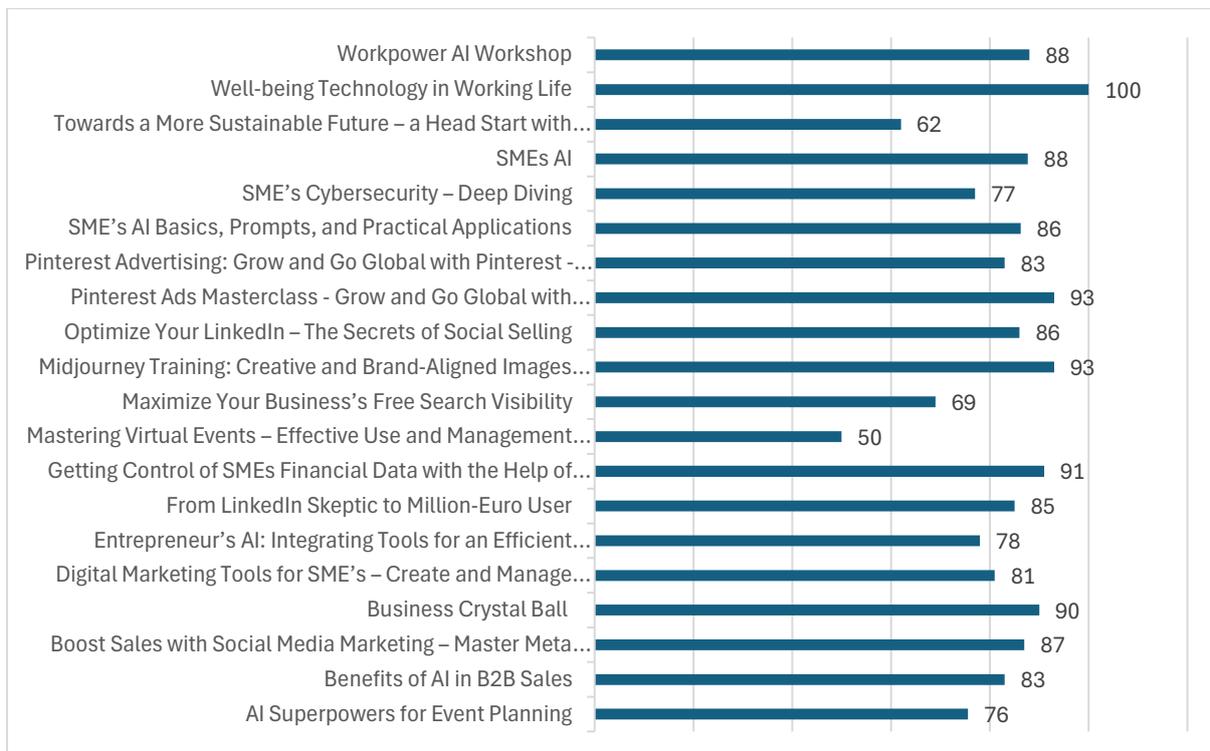


Figure 25: Average score (out of 100) of courses from Robocast

Course analysis

In this chapter we present the analysis of individual courses based on the collected data set from the **common evaluation form**. Each course will be presented in a table. The table will contain the title of the course, followed by the number of responses and optionally followed by some introductory course details. Then we have the analysis of the course which will be demonstrated by showing the counts of results relating to scaled questions available on the evaluation form. All analysis graphs refer to a scale from 1 to 5 with 1 being very dis-satisfied (i.e. worst) and 5 being very satisfied (i.e. best). The information continues by providing indicative answers to open ended questions ('what did you like most?', 'how can we improve the course?' and a positive 'testimonial'). The final section of the analysis indicates how many (if any) respondent participants were willing to subscribe to the newsletter of the project; and it concludes by providing some brief conclusion related to the performance and evaluation of the course. The table below provides a sample course to demonstrate the layout to expect.

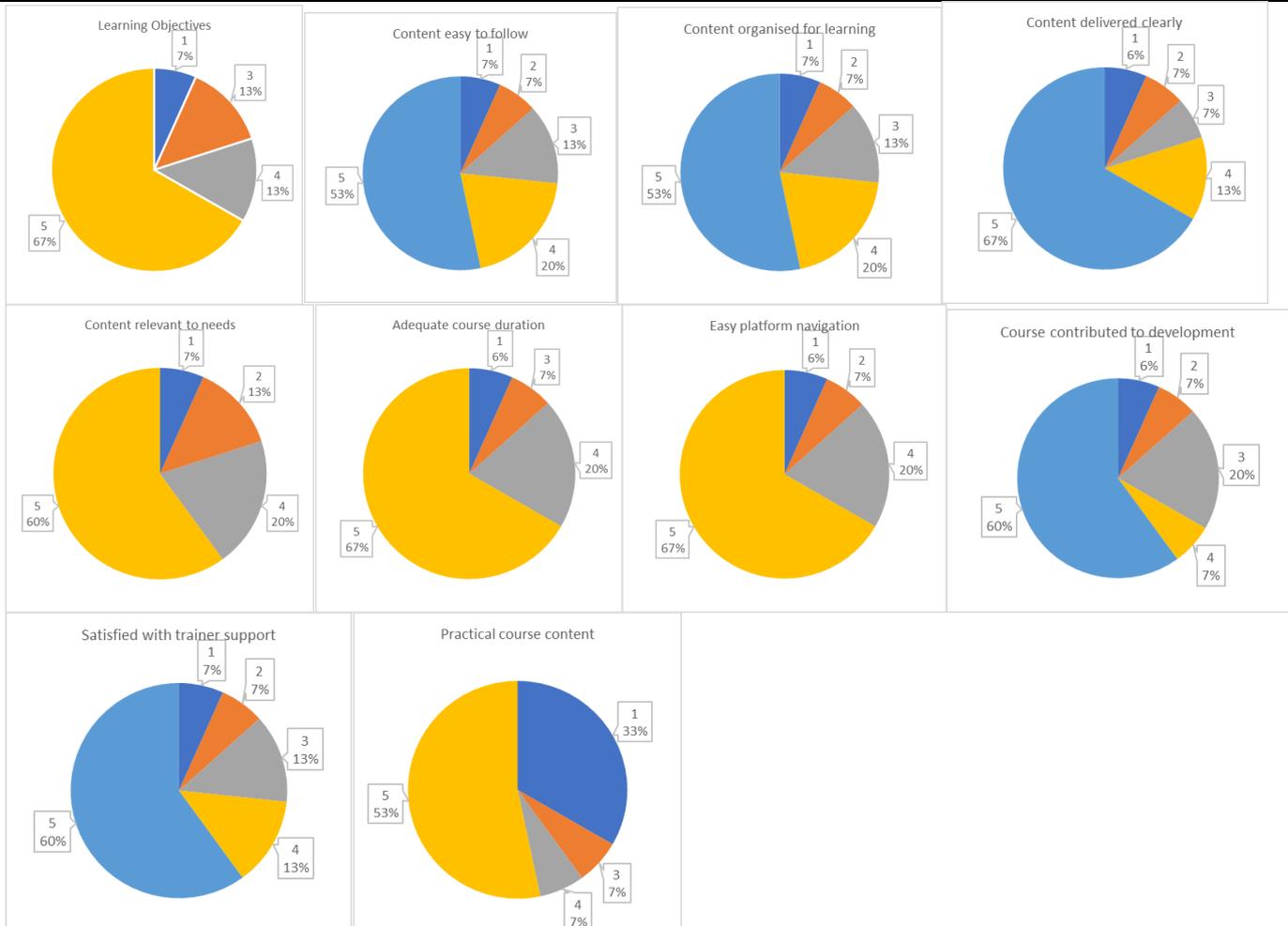

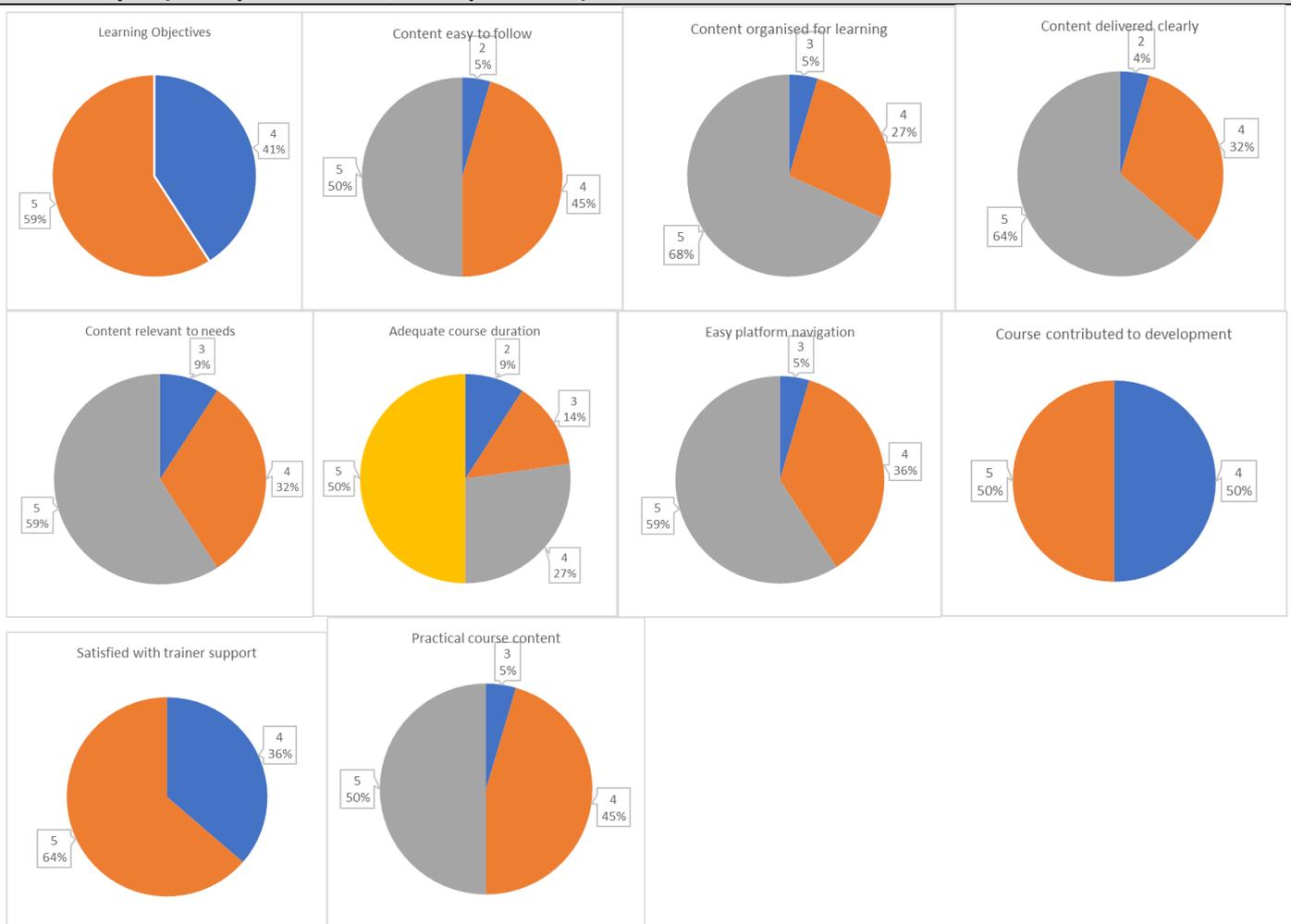
73% of respondents were satisfied or very satisfied with the 'content being easy to follow' and the 'content being organized for learning'. 80% claimed the 'content was delivered clearly' with 87% suggesting 'adequate time for delivery' and 80% said that the 'content is relevant to needs'. The percentage of the question relating to 'the course contributing to professional development, competences and skills' was 67%. This number is a little lower relative to others. This will be further discussed and explained in the impact chapter. 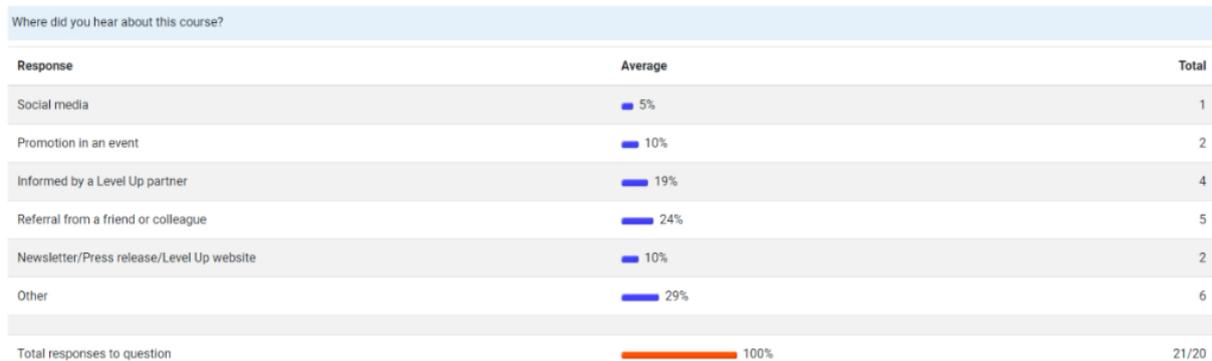

Conclusions

The course on Social Media Management for SMEs received positive feedback on its easily understandable content (80% of the respondents) and the way it was structured, which facilitated the learning process (70%). The duration of the course was also appreciated (65%) as well as the support from the trainer (55%). The introductory course to microcontrollers includes videos, quizzes and other types of learning material, and it is available on CSC’s e-learning platform, Inventing the Future (<https://inventingthefuture.eu/>). To the writing of this report, a total of 6 participants attended this course.

Data Analysis

2 participants from Italy left their feedback through the questionnaire at the end of the course. Figure 2 and Table 2.

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Conclusions

Participants provided valuable feedback on the course. They expressed satisfaction on the structure of the platform, which was easy to navigate, and appear to be overall satisfied with the duration of the course and the support of the trainer. Although it is a difficult topic, participants stated that the content effectively clarified misconceptions, and expressed the desire for more practical learning experiences to complement the theoretical knowledge presented.

C3. Digital Tools: Getting Started with the Google Suite (face-to-face)

A course dedicated to Google’s digital tools, specifically focusing on Google Documents and Google Sheets, was held on 05/06/24 and /07/06/24 in Palermo. The classes were conducted in Spanish, since it is the technician’s native language, with a group of 19 participants, 4 day 6 June and 15 day 7 June .

Data Analysis

19 participants from Italy, 17 provided their feedback through the online survey. The evaluation results are presented in Table 3 and Table 4.

We proceeded in this analysis by entering the number of responses for each score.

conclusions

The majority of the participants (94%) evaluated the course positively, enjoying the clarity of the content and the way it was organized. They were also particularly satisfied with the tutor of the course, and found the platform easy to navigate. Many participants found the course very useful for enhancing their ability to navigate Google tools more quickly, while some others suggested adding more content in order to extend the course. Moreover, participants stated that this learning experience intrigued them and sparked their interest in learning more about these valuable tools. Lastly, most of the participants reported having found the course through another organization.

Impact

Impact on participants

Common evaluation survey

The data set from the common evaluation survey investigated various aspects of the impact that courses have had on participants. Based on the received feedback it can be concluded that participants were overall satisfied with courses. The figure below shows the scores obtained for the questions asked

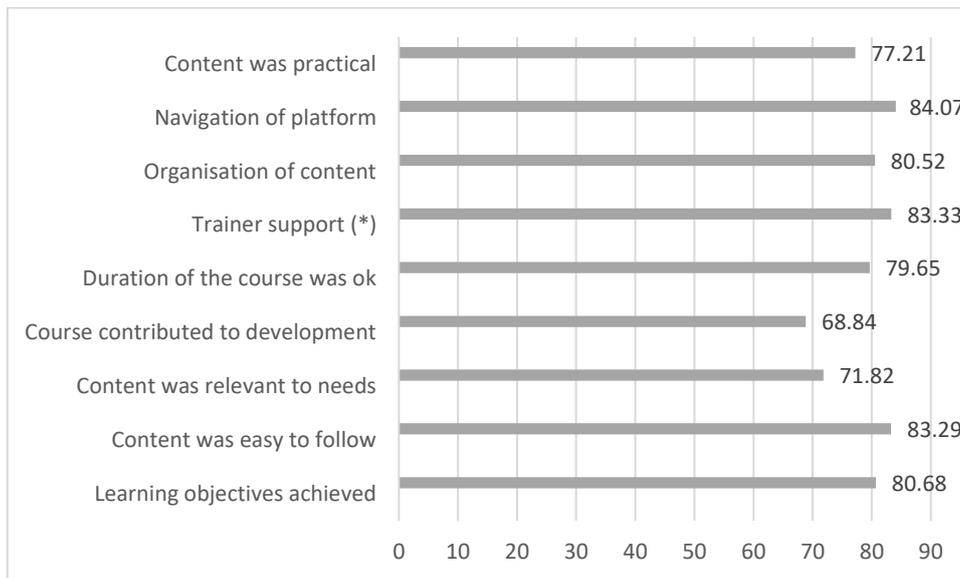


Figure 26: Common evaluation survey, question scores

The score for the question “The course contributed to the development of my professional competencies, knowledge and skills” (shortened in the graph as ‘course contributed to development’) is the lowest at 68.84. This can be explained as part of the trend for courses to embrace artificial intelligence in any opportunity. Consider the scale 3 percentage which was 22.57 or a total of 336 entries. Out of these 336 entries 270 had to do with a course relating to AI. As a technology it is new and exciting, it does offer many new possibilities for many aspects of business, science etc. However, a short duration course, which does not provide in depth knowledge, and is usually focused on a certain aspect or a specific usage or application, does not contribute much to professional competencies knowledge and skills of a professional. The course acts as an introduction, it can attract the interest of someone to further investigate and get involved with the technology, none the less it does not provide enough background and experience to be considered as a major contribution to professional competencies, knowledge and skills. More is needed. This would explain that almost a quarter of the participants answered neutrally for this question (neither satisfied nor dis-satisfied). The same exact argument could be made for the second lowest scoring question “The course content



was relevant to my needs” (which was shortened in the graph as ‘course relevant to needs’) which achieved a score of 71.82. In this case 303 participants used option 3 as their answer and looking at the courses, 234 of them were AI related. Now consider that those 303 answers represent a 20.34% (that’s a fifth of participants).

In both cases, things might have been different if some aspects of the course(s) were altered to align a little more with the needs of the participants and offer an opportunity to develop competencies and skills.

In other numbers, the evaluation results demonstrate a high level of satisfaction across most aspects of the training programme. More than **80% indicated that learning outcomes were clearly stated and achieved**; more than **83% answered that the content was easy to follow**, reflecting the clarity and coherence of the course design and delivery. **Organisation of the content also scored about 80%** with **platform navigation scoring, the highest, above 84%**. Satisfaction with the **duration of the course was at above 79%** suggesting the time allocated was appropriate but might need a small increase and finally **more than 77% answered that the course content was practical enough**. This slightly lower than the 80 mark suggests a need to strengthen the practical dimension of training through additional exercises, demonstrations, case studies, and applied activities

Integrating the above scores to use a single number and characterise common evaluation survey courses, results in an average score of 78.82.

Overall, the evidence indicates that the training programme under WP5 has been highly effective in upskilling and reskilling participants, with relatively strong results across all satisfaction indicators and a clear impact on learners’ digital readiness.

Individual implementation evaluations

The primary question from Workearly (“rating the section as a whole”) achieved an average of 91.31

The average score from Robocoast achieved a score of 82.16

Scientific impact

Here we attempt to present some key findings from the analysis of the training program evaluations:

- It has been evident that the trainings do work in providing necessary skills to participants. Numerous answers to the ‘what did you like most’ question included: **“great info about things I did not know”** (chat GPT in education); **“interest topics and useful for my future”** (experimental techniques in system biology); **“I learned new things”** (Google Tools to Run Your Business More Efficiently); **“new tools that we didn’t know before”** (Digital Efficiency for SMEs); **“to learn new and useful netsites”** (Virtual meeting 22.5.); **“Good tips for Canva”** (Canva 28.5.); **“learning new practical social media tools”** (Excel (Workearly)); **“I didn’t even now what Canva was up until now and all the features that it provides. Very cool.”** (Optimize Workflow with Canva: Enhance Efficiency, Collaboration, and Design in Project Management); **“There was a deep enough look into many functions of excel that will make it easier for me**

to henceforth discover several on my own” (Excel for data reporting); “...With features like pivot tables, conditional formatting, and built-in formulas, you can easily organize, analyze, and visualize large datasets ...” (Excel for data reporting); “... for someone that doesn’t have tik tok or never created any video, all the information was gold!” (How to grow your SME with viral TikTok strategies?); “it gave me tips to use CHAT GPT in a better way” (Chat GPT, 17-April); “NEW IDEAS” (Digital marketing and social media); “The techniques we learned” (TikTok – Learn how to create stunning videos); “how to protect myself from the internet” (Cybersecurity 30.5); “understanding how many features the excel provides in data reporting” (excel for data reporting); and more.

- Especially when it comes to introducing software tools, practical examples and hands-on interactive activities should accompany any training course. Learning to do things from a book or a video cannot provide the same experience as actually completing any task and the associated activity under the guidance of an experienced trainer and a well-structured tutorial plan. There are numerous instances in the answers to the ‘how can we improve the course’ that suggest more examples, more exercises, more quizzes, more practical hands-on activities, more time for practice.

Economic impact

The economic impact of the training programme is evident in the way it strengthened participants’ employability, productivity, and capacity to contribute to digitally enabled workplaces. Many participants reported gaining new or enhanced knowledge that they were able to apply directly in their professional roles, improving the efficiency of daily tasks and supporting more informed decision-making. Jobseekers and early-career professionals benefited in particular from exposure to cutting-edge tools and technologies, which are increasingly required in the labour market and therefore enhance their competitiveness. At the same time, employees in the workforce expanded their practical digital skills—such as automation, data handling, and the use of AI-driven tools—leading to improved operational performance within SMEs. Overall, the feedback confirms that the training offer delivered tangible economic value by equipping individuals with relevant, market-aligned skills that support both career progression and organizational digital transformation.

Societal impact

The training programmes have contributed meaningfully to strengthening digital literacy at a broader societal level. By equipping participants with practical digital skills, critical thinking abilities, and increased confidence in using modern tools, the programme supports more informed and responsible engagement in digital environments. As participants apply these skills in their workplaces, communities, and everyday digital interactions, they help diffuse digital knowledge more widely, reducing skill gaps and fostering a culture of continuous learning. In this way, the impact of the training extends beyond individual beneficiaries and contributes to a more digitally capable and resilient society.
